had helped transform the american religious landscape and grown his own political power substantially yet the standing of the mormon people in american society remained unstable unable to garner federal protection and having failed to win the support of former president martin van buren or any of the other candidates in the race smith decided to take matters into his own hands launching his own bid for the presidency while many scoffed at the notion that smith could come anywhere close to the white house others regarded his run and his religion as a threat to the stability of the young nation hounded by mobs throughout the campaign smith was ultimately killed by one of the first presidential candidates to be assassinated though joseph smith's run for president is now best remembered when it is remembered at all for its gruesome end the renegade campaign was revolutionary smith called for the total abolition of slavery the closure of the country's penitentiaries and the reestablishment of a national bank to stabilize the economy but smith's most important proposal was for an expansion of protections for religious minorities at a time when the bill of rights did not by the election year of 1844 Joseph Smith the controversial founder of the church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints had amassed a national following of some 25 000 believers nearly half of them lived in the city of Nauvoo Illinois where Smith was not only their religious leader but also the mayor and the commander in chief of a militia of some 2 500 men in less than twenty years Smith had helped transform the American religious landscape and grown his own political power substantially yet the standing of the mormon people in American society remained unstable unable to garner federal protection and having failed to win the support of former president Martin Van Buren or any of the other candidates in the race Smith decided to take matters into his own hands launching his own bid for the presidency while many scoffed at the notion that Smith could come anywhere close to the White House others regarded his run and his religion as a threat to the stability of the young nation hounded by mobs throughout the campaign Smith was ultimately killed by one of the first presidential candidates to be assassinated though Joseph Smith's run for president is now best remembered when it is remembered at all for its gruesome end the renegade campaign was revolutionary Smith called for the total abolition of slavery the closure of the country's penitentiaries and the reestablishment of a national bank to stabilize the economy but Smith's most important proposal was for an expansion of protections for religious minorities at a time when the bill of rights did not apply to individual states Smith sought to empower the federal government to protect minorities when states failed to do so Spencer W. history of joseph smith by his mother is a biography of joseph smith founder of the latter day saint movement according to his mother lucy mack smith shortly following the death of joseph smith in 1844 and into 1845 lucy mack smith dictated her recollections and family story to nauvoo schoolteacher martha jane coray who compiled these books of notes and other sources into a manuscript publication of the book came with the great controversy after its publication brigham young declared the book to be a tissue of lies and wanted corrections made young possibly opposed the book because of his own conflicts with its publisher orson pratt lucy smith portrayed the smith family as the legitimate leaders of the church which young may also have seen as a challenge to his leadership
