the international arena television calls the tune the political balance of power has shifted towards asia one day cricket in coloured clothing is ubiquitous and run rates rise inexorably while batsmen tear bowlers to pieces as never before to the gnarled old pros of the 1950s the game must be unrecognisable a genuine revolution charted in 40 000 wisden pages over the past 30 years is now distilled into a 1 280 page anthology that selects the matches players events and controversies which ushered the game into a brave new century
