first boy in the family who learned the use of the pen there are lincolns in kentucky and tennessee belonging to the same stock with the president whose names are spelled linkhorn and linkhern all that was known of the emigrant abraham lincoln by his immediate descendants was that his progenitors who were quakers came from berks county pennsylvania into virginia and there throve and prospered footnote we desire to express our obligations to edwin salter samuel l smedley samuel shackford samuel w pennypacker howard m jenkins and john t harris jr for information and suggestions which have been of use to us in this chapter but we now know with sufficient clearness through the wide spread and searching luster which surrounds the name the history of the migrations of the family since its arrival on this continent and the circumstances under which the virginia pioneer started for kentucky
