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evidence based practice in nursing involves providing holistic quality care based on the most up to date research and knowledge rather than traditional methods advice from colleagues or personal beliefs the nursing professional development evidence based practice ebp academy is a 12 month mentored program designed to guide the npd practitioner through creating picot questions gathering and critically appraising literature and ebp implementation evaluation dissemination and sustainment evidence based practice in nursing is an approach to providing nursing care that uses the most current research available to improve the safety health and well being of patients this practice focuses on delivering high guality patient care while reducing healthcare costs and variations in patient outcomes evidence based nursing systematically searches a wide range of international healthcare journals applying strict criteria for the validity of research and relevance to best nursing practice in this issue an article by professor ying ju chang and colleagues at national cheng kung university presents an evidence based practice curriculum for undergraduate nursing students developed using an action research based model as nurses we often hear the term evidence based practice ebp but what does it actually mean ebp is a process used to review analyze and translate the latest scientific evidence research studies show that evidence based practice ebg leads to higher quality care improved patient outcomes reduced costs and greater nurse satisfaction than traditional approaches to care 1 5 despite these favorable findings many nurses remain inconsistent in their implementation of evidence based care evidence based practice ebp the purposeful integration of researched best evidence into clinical practice is considered the basis of safe and effective nursing practice to deliver exceptional patient centered care improve patient outcomes and satisfaction reduce healthcare costs and increase clinician satisfaction evidence based practice in nursing is a lifelong learning technique driven by the following steps thorough mindful application of these five steps has the potential to complete a cycle that s destined to improve clinical practice and patient care pose a question what are some examples of evidence based practice in nursing evidence based practice ebp integrates clinical expertise best research evidence and patient values to optimize health outcomes this approach supports the nursing profession in delivering guality patient care lawler s work on how the body is managed by nurses illustrates this 6 she explains how an understanding of the physiological body is essential but that this must be complemented by evidence from the social sciences because we also practice with living breathing speaking humans specifically how ebp models and frameworks used in healthcare settings align with the original model of 1 asking the guestion 2 acquiring the best evidence 3 appraising the evidence 4 applying the findings to clinical practice and 5 evaluating the outcomes of change along with patient values and preferences and clinical skills evidence based practice in nursing is so ubiguitous today that in some respects it is nursing at its core ebp is the assessment and implementation of medical research and knowledge to take a more rigorous documented and evidence focused approach to patient care what are the 5 steps of evidence based practice in nursing asking a clear and focused clinical question the first step in ebp involves formulating a specific and answerable question using the pico format the american journal of nursing s series on evidence based practice step by step gives nurses the knowledge and skills to implement ebp consistently one step at a time step 0 cultivate inquiry step 1 ask clinical questions step 2 find the evidence step 3 appraise the evidence one of the key principles in medicine today is evidence based practice in nursing ebp this is the practice of medicine based on solid research and it adheres to standards for high quality and safety all while focusing on patients needs this is also why ebp is typically part of rn to bsn program curriculum examples of ebp in nursing although the undermining of the nursing profession time constraints and the lack of inclusive teaching of evidence based nursing ebn in the nursing school s curriculum have long been identified as being some of the main barriers to the adoption of evidence based practice ebp by nurses the specific role of nurse leaders in directly influen background nursing theory guided practice helps improve the guality of nursing care because it allows nurses to articulate what they do for patients and why they do it however the usefulness of nursing theory guided practice has been questioned and more emphasis has been placed on evidence based nursing and traditional practice

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
