palliative care is specialized medical care for people living with a serious illness such as cancer or heart failure patients in palliative care may receive medical care for their symptoms or palliative care along with treatment intended to cure their serious illness palliative care is specialized medical care that focuses on providing relief from pain and other symptoms of a serious illness it also can help you cope with side effects from medical treatments the availability of palliative care does not depend on whether your condition can be cured palliative care is a specialized form of care that provides symptom relief comfort and support to individuals living with serious illnesses it also provides support to caregivers and those impacted by a loved one's condition palliative care complements the care you receive from the providers in charge of your care plan palliative care is meant to relieve symptoms such as pain breathing difficulties or nausea among others disease itself side effects of treatment and stress and uncertainty about the future palliative care is focused on improving the overall wellness of people with serious illnesses it addresses both the symptoms and the stress of living with a chronic illness palliative care is a special approach to caring for anyone with serious illness such as cancer palliative care focuses on improving the quality of life by helping patients and caregivers manage the symptoms of a serious illness and side effects of treatment palliative care provides relief from symptoms including pain shortness of breath fatigue constipation nausea loss of appetite problems with sleep and many other symptoms it can also help you deal with the side effects of the medical treatments you're receiving palliative care is an approach to care that addresses the person as a whole not just their disease the goal is to prevent or treat as early as possible the symptoms and side effects of the disease and its treatment in addition to any related psychological social and spiritual problems palliative care is a specialized type of medical care for people who have a serious or life threatening illness and their families palliative care is most often offered and started by the cancer care team who is giving your treatment the doctors and nurses you see during your treatment visits may provide some palliative care themselves such as helping to manage symptoms and side effects like nausea or pain palliative care provides an extra layer of support that can improve your quality of life not just in your body but also in your mind and spirit sometimes palliative care is combined with curative treatment the kind of care you get depends on what you need your goals guide your care all about cancer managing cancer
