in the late 1980s pediatric endocrinologists at the children's hospital in winnipeg began to notice a new cohort appearing in their clinics for young people with diabetes indigenous youngsters from two first nations in northern manitoba and northwestern ontario were showing up not with type 1 or insulin dependent diabetes but with what looked like type 2 diabetes until then a condition that was restricted to people much older investigation led the doctors to learn that something similar had become a medical issue among young people of the pima indian nation in arizona though to their knowledge nobody else but these youth were just the tip of the iceberg over the next few decades more children would confront what was turning into not only a medical but also a social and community challenge diagnosing the legacy is the story of communities researchers and doctors who faced and continue to face something never seen before type 2 diabetes in younger and younger people through dozens of interviews krotz shows the impact of the disease on the lives of individuals and families as well as the challenges caregivers faced diagnosing and then responding to the complex and perplexing disease especially in communities far removed from the medical personnel a facilities available in the city

The Legacy of Slavery at Harvard

harvard s searing and sobering indictment of its own long standing relationship with chattel slavery and anti black discrimination in recent years scholars have documented extensive relationships between american higher education and slavery the legacy of slavery at harvard adds harvard university to the long list of institutions in the north and the south entangled with slavery and its aftermath the report written by leading researchers from across the university reveals hard truths about harvard s deep ties to black and indigenous bondage scientific racism segregation and other forms of oppression between the university s founding in 1636 and 1783 when slavery officially ended in massachusetts harvard leaders faculty and staff enslaved at least seventy people some of whom worked on campus where they cared for students faculty and university presidents harvard also benefited financially and reputationally from donations by slaveholders slave traders and others whose fortunes depended on human chattel later harvard professors and the graduates they trained were leaders in so called race science and eugenics which promoted disinvestment in black lives through forced sterilization residential segregation and segregation and discrimination in education no institution of harvard s scale and longevity is a monolith harvard was also home to abolitionists and pioneering black thinkers and activists such as we be du bois charles hamilton houston and eva beatrice dykes in the late twentieth century the university became a champion of racial diversity in education yet the past cannot help casting a long shadow on the present harvard's motto veritas inscribed on gates doorways and sculptures all over campus is an exhortation to pursue truth the legacy of slavery at harvard advances that necessary quest

The Legacy of Ruth Klüger and the End of the Auschwitz Century

ruth klüger 1931 2020 passed away on october 5 2020 in the u s born in vienna and deported to theresienstadt she survived auschwitz and the shoah together with her mother after living in germany for a short time after the war she immigrated to new york she was educated in the u s and received degrees in english literature as well as her ph d in german literature at the university of california berkeley she taught at several american universities she has numerous scholarly publications to her credit mostly in the fields of german and austrian literary history she is also recognized as a poet in her own right an essayist and a feminist critic she returned to europe where she was a guest professor in göttingen and vienna her memoir entitled weiter leben 1992 which she translated and revised in an english parallel text as still alive was a major bestseller and highly regarded autobiographical account of a holocaust survivor it was subsequently translated into more than a dozen languages it has also generated a vigorous critical discussion in its own right ruth klüger received numerous prestigious literary prizes and other distinctions the present volume the legacy of ruth klüger and the end of the auschwitz century aims to honor her memory by assessing critically her writings and career taking her biography and writings as points of departure the volume includes contributions in fields and from perspectives which her writings helped to bring into focus acutely in the table of contents are

created barriers between races in the divided society appeals to legitimacy such as by abolitionists and the civil rights movement were essential to change laws from support of the divided society to instruments for disestablishing it thanks to the rule of law another important british legacy the u s is much farther along than many former colonies in making progress by highlighting the history of the interplay of two fundamental concepts the divided society and the rule of law and briefly contrasting the experiences of other former colonies this book shows how the united states has made significant long term progress although incomplete and ways for this to continue today
