expression in the leading concepts and principles of the criminal law to what extent are fundamental rights and principles of the rule of law sufficiently reflected in the practices of restorative justice how are these practices to be related to the criminal justice system according to the normative aspirations of a democratic constitutional state to what degree can current penal practices be aspirations these fundamental questions formed the intellectual framework for the 10th aquinas conference on restorative justice punishment and the morality of law at which conference the larger part
