shattered but if one looks at mission in india qualitatively rather than quantitatively one sees a number of positive outcomes missionaries in india particularly protestant missionaries espousing the social gospel in collaboration with a few british evangelical administrators dared to challenge numerous social evils and even began to eradicate them the scientific and liberal english education began to enlighten and transform the indian mindset converts belonging to the upper caste although small in number laid the foundation stone of indian theology and an inculturated church using indian genius the end of colonialism in india coincided with the painful death of colonial mission theology now the power of the word of god extricated from political power is slowly and peacefully gaining ground like the mustard seed of the parable a paradigm shift from the ecclesio centric mission to missio dei offers reason for further optimism in short the future of mission in india is as bright as the kingdom of god in today s new context theologians despite objections from some quarters are struggling to discover the asian face of jesus disfigured by the greco roman church and the missionary is challenged to become a living bible that undoubtedly everyone will read

do you want to make a difference in the world but feel overwhelmed by all there is to do do you sometimes doubt that significant change is even possible there is good news god isn't worried about the future of the world nor is god merely bringing minor changes behold i make all things new says the lord the coming kingdom brings total transformation metamorphosis what's more god doesn't call us to carry the burdens of the world and its transformation on our own shoulders christ carries the world and by the power of the spirit we live in christ we do not have a mission for god in the world rather the god of mission has us in the world each of us has a vital role in the world we are invited to participate god's generous love bringing heaven to earth through us now the seven sessions of beyond duty guide individuals groups and churches to our places as participants in god's mission in the world i originally wrote beyond duty to help liberate mission fanatics like me from enslavement to a human centered approach to mission that liberation is still needed today in our

eagerness to make a difference in the world we can quickly subvert the good news of god's sovereign love into our ambitious burdensome and at times tedious effort to fulfill our mission in the world this revised and expanded edition pursues this seeking god's liberating grace to free us from the vain presumption that the future of god's mission is up to us through a combination of our compassion regarding urgent needs what feels to us like the inactivity of god and the drive of our own need to make a difference in the world many of us all too easily take the needs of the world onto our shoulders as our personal responsibility this sounds so foolish however mission narcissism runs deep though it may be obvious it still deserves to be said again our central commitment is to god and god's kingdom not to ourselves or our service for god in that kingdom to make anything other than loving god and living in god's love for our neighbor even something as good and noble as god's mission in the world the central passion and commitment of our life is just plain old idolatry dressed in christian clothing i've lived much of my life seeking to serve in god's mission but i wonder at times for whom i am really working my suspicion is that sometimes i've spread the unpleasant aroma of my need to make a difference in the world more than the sweet aroma of christ in my more honest moments i admit that some of my mission was to reinforce my sense of significance it's so easy to become intoxicated by the seductive lies of our society that size determines significance speed measures impact and worth

this fascinating story of a dutch reformed mission among the karo of north sumatra chronicles the field s first fifteen years 1889 1904 plantation executives sponsored the mission hoping to enlist the karo as christian allies in a colonial war against muslim fanatics but the karo hated the plantations and likewise distrusted and resisted the missionaries civil servants saw the mission as a forerunner of the government s annexation of the sumatran highlands and in the military expedition to take the region the missionaries played a prominent role consequently the missionaries found their credibility diminished by their links to the despised colonial apparatus nonetheless the missionaries motives were religious and they struggled with the compromises that made their work possible yet ultimately precluded its success unlike other missionary studies that focus on biography or on large regions this historical ethnography concentrates on a single field and on the personalities and activities of the several men who pioneered it in its formative years it examines the missionaries assumptions and values describe how the missionaries contrasted themselves with the government and capitalist business and explores the difficulties of translating christianity across a great cultural gulf the early
