many teens who attempt or die by suicide have a mental health illness as a result they have trouble coping with the stress of being a teen they might have a very hard time dealing with rejection failure breakups school troubles or family problems before attempting to take their own life a teen may have thoughts of wanting to die this is called suicidal ideation they may also have suicidal behavior that is when a teen is focused on doing things that cause their own death a comprehensive approach to suicide prevention is important and includes identification of youth at risk for suicide intervention to prevent attempts in those at risk addressing access to lethal means and decreasing lethality of the means used if there is an attempt children and teens who struggle with suicidal thoughts can recover and live happy fulfilling lives parents support is often a critical component of this journey for those of us who work with adolescents and or their parents the hope is that early recognition and intervention can prevent suicidal behavior and premature deaths etiology risk and protective processes suicide has no single cause and the causes and predictors of suicide and sas vary across individuals knowledge of risk factors particularly mood disorders psychosis and bullying victimization and perpetration may assist in the identification of adolescents who are at higher risk it is important to know and use appropriate techniques for interviewing potentially suicidal adolescents talking to teens suicide prevention suicide is a difficult topic but it is too important to ignore suicide is the second leading cause of death for young people ages 15 to 24 despite a common belief that only teens and adults die by suicide younger children can also be at risk depression and suicide often coincide the global health problem of adolescent suicide means not only an individual disaster but also a systemic failure if we are genuinely interested in providing better support for our youth at suicidal risk a more systemic approach to risk assessment and suicide intervention and prevention is warranted suicidal ideation and attempt are closely associated with mental health problems mhps 4 13 14 with the vast majority of adolescents with suicidal ideation and or suicide attempt meeting criteria for at least one mhp despite the potential benefits of parents adolescent relationships on suicidal behaviours among adolescents research on these topics are importantly limited by lack of comprehensiveness difficulties in cross country comparisons and limited generalisability among others although some studies suggest that suicidal ideation is associated with a higher risk of suicide and is far more prevalent than attempted suicides a considerable percentage of children and adolescents that commit suicide have no prior suicide attempts 7 8 in fact a metanalysis found that 3 of high risk patients discharged from a social and contextual factors particularly important during adolescence have been associated with greater vulnerability to suicide 61 in fact involvement in bullying as a victim perpetrator or bully victim has been associated with suicidal ideation and behaviour in various meta analyses 62 63 objective this research aims to investigate what type of family patterns specifically attachment bonding and family functioning and

stressful life events can trigger or protect adolescents from developing suicidal behavior based on data from 2021 the report showed that 57 of teenage girls had persistent feelings of sadness or hopelessness that year the highest level reported in the past decade and as many as 30 had seriously considered suicide the suicide rate is up almost 60 from a decade ago a meta analysis of 52 studies all using retrospective self report found that the strongest correlates of suicide attempts among adolescents who engaged in non suicidal self harm were suicidal ideation hopelessness and non suicidal self harm characteristics frequency and number of methods the identified needs of adolescents with suicidal behaviour can broadly be grouped into needs related to the following areas the importance of connecting with other people adolescents self help strategies and personal growth after self harm mental healthcare school or study programs and needs related to society in relation to taboo on suic understanding the burden and determinants of suicide during adolescence is key to achieving global health goals we examined the prevalence and determinants of self reported suicidal ideation and attempts among younger 13 15 years and older adolescents 16 17 years methods according to the cdc the rates of suicide self harm anxiety and depression are up among adolescents a trend that began before the pandemic last may we took you to milwaukee wisconsin a new york dynamic deconstructive psychotherapy appeared effective at reducing suicide ideation among suicidal adolescents according to a poster presented at the american psychiatric with some evidence suggesting that more adolescents have been reporting suicidal thoughts during the pandemic experts and parents are looking for ways to help
