they had to those countries and so have by positive agreement settled a property amongst themselves in distinct parts and parcels of the earth yet there are still great tracts of ground to be found which the inhabitants thereof not having joined with the rest of mankind in the consent of the use of their common money lie waste and are more than the people who dwell on it do or can make use of and so still lie in common tho this can scarce happen amongst that part of mankind that have consented to the use of money about john locke the author while it was once thought that locke wrote the treatises to defend the glorious revolution of 1688 recent scholarship has shown that the work was composed well before this date and it is now viewed as a more general argument against absolute monarchy particularly as espoused by robert filmer and thomas hobbes and for individual consent as the basis of political legitimacy locke s some thoughts concerning education is an outline on how to educate this mind he expresses the belief that education maketh the man or more fundamentally that the mind is an empty cabinet with the statement i think i may say that of all the men we meet with nine parts of ten are what they are good or evil useful or not by their education
