it relates to the latest findings in the field of neuroscience the book is essential reading for all practicing therapists and counselors as well as trainee therapists particularly those who want to explore the potential of experiential dimensions in their therapy and coaching practice jessica kingsley publishers also publishes a companion volume emerging practice in focusing oriented psychotherapy innovative theory and applications edited by greg madison 9781849053716 by exploring various ways to assimilate recent progressive developments and to renew its vital links with its radical roots re visioning person centred therapy theory and practice of a radical paradigm takes a fresh look at this revolutionary therapeutic approach bringing together leading figures in pct and new writers from around the world the essays in this book create fertile links with phenomenology meditation and spirituality critical theory contemporary thought and culture and philosophy of science in doing so they create an outline that renews and re visions person centred therapy s radical paradigm providing fertile material in both theory and practice shot through with clinical studies vignettes and in depth discussions on aspects of theory re visioning person centred therapy will be stimulating reading for therapists in training and practice as well as those interested in the development of pct after a long period of relatively slow change and development the practice of psychotherapy entered a phase of vigorous experimentation in the 1960s greatly increased public recognition of the role of psychological approaches has brought about a dramatic upsurge of demand for mental health services on the part of broader segments of the population than ever before many kinds of people now seek aid and display a greater variety of symptoms and life problems than are recorded in the earlier case history literature the professional response to this new demand markedly increased the professions creativity and imagination as this volume outlines while it is difficult to devise a precise category to cover all forms of such experimentation in psychotherapy one major characteristic has been an increase in activity the non directive or client centered therapist frequently speaks almost as much as his client yet he is not considered active since he attempts to limit his communication to the reflection of the clients feelings more frequently an attempt is made to distinguish between insight oriented therapies and active therapies in terms of differing goals active psychotherapy is seen as being concerned with techniques that focus directly on the removal of symptoms such as anxiety or maladaptive overt behavior the need to establish a clear dichotomy between insight and behavior modification has often been challenged many of the therapists who stress insight do
