in his historic play the melting pot israel zangwill 1864 1926 introduced into our discourse a potent metaphor that for nearly a hundred years has served as a key definition of the united states the play enthusiastically espoused by president theodore roosevelt to whom it was dedicated offered a grand vision of america as a dynamic process of ethnic and racial amalgamation by his own admission the melting pot grew out of zangwill s intense involvement in issues of jewish immigration and resettlement and was grounded in his interpretation of jewish history zangwill anglo jewry s most renowned writer began writing seriously for the stage in the late 1890s at the time the negative stereotype of the so called stage jew was still deeply entrenched in the theatrical mainstream so much so that jewish playwrights writing for the english language stage avoided altogether the portrayal of jewish life zangwill shattered this silence in 1899 with the american premiere of children of the ghetto his first full length drama and the first english language play devoted in its entirety to the depiction of jewish life in an authentic and positive fashion the play s groundbreaking production drew tremendous attention and generated heated debates but since the script was never published the memory of the passions it generated dimmed and its whereabouts eventually became unknown after more than a century theater historian edna nahshon has discovered the original manuscript of this milestone text as well as that of another unpublished zangwill play the king of schnorrers and the original version of the melting pot nahshon brings these three works together in print for the first time in from the ghetto to the melting pot edna nahshon s in depth introduction to this volume includes a biography of israel zangwill that especially pertains to these works and situates them within the anglo american theater of the time the essays preceding each play provide rich and hitherto unknown information on the scripts their stage productions and their popular and critical reception while some issues addressed in from the ghetto to the melting pot are uniquely jewish others are universal and typical of the negotiation of self presentation by ethnic and minority groups particularly within the american experience

a rhetorical exploration of an underexamined side of climate change the ongoing research into and development of geoengineering strategies geoengineering persuasion and the climate crisis a geologic rhetoric exposes the deeply worrying state of discourse over geoengineering the intentional manipulation of the earth s climate as means to halt or reverse global warming these climate altering projects which range from cloud whitening to carbon dioxide removal and from stratospheric aerosol injection to enhanced weathering are all technological solutions to more complex geosocial problems geoengineering represents one of the most alarming forms of deliberative discourse in the twenty first century yet geoengineering could easily generate as much harm as the environmental traumas it seeks to cure complicating these deliberations is the scarcity of public discussion most deliberations transpire within policy groups behind the closed doors of climate oriented startups between subject matter experts at scientific conferences or in the disciplinary jargon of research journals further much of this conversation occurs primarily in the west ehren helmut pflugfelder makes clear how the deliberative rhetorical strategies coming from geoengineering advocates have been largely deceptive hegemonic deterministic and exploitative in this volume he investigates how geoengineering proponents marshal geologic actors into their arguments and how current discourse could

lead to a greater exploitation of the earth in the future pflugfelder s goal is to understand the structure content purpose and effect of these discourses raise the alarm about their deliberative directions and help us rethink our approach to the climate in highlighting both the inherent problems of the discourses and the ways geologic rhetoric can be made productive he attempts to give the geologic a place at the table to better understand the roles that all earth systems continue to play in our lives now and for years to come

recent acts of terrorism in britain and europe and the events of 9 11 in the united states have greatly influenced immigration security and integration policies in these countries yet many of the current practices surrounding these issues were developed decades ago and are ill suited to the dynamics of today s global economies and immigration patterns at the core of much policy debate is the inherent paradox whereby immigrant populations are frequently perceived as posing a potential security threat yet bolster economies by providing an inexpensive workforce strict attention to border controls and immigration quotas has diverted focus away from perhaps the most significant dilemma the integration of existing immigrant groups often restricted in their civil and political rights and targets of xenophobia racial profiling and discrimination immigrants are unable or unwilling to integrate into the population these factors breed distrust disenfranchisement and hatred factors that potentially engender radicalization and can even threaten internal security the contributors compare policies on these issues at three relational levels between individual eu nations and the u s between the eu and u s and among eu nations what emerges is a timely and critical examination of the variations and contradictions in policy at each level of interaction and how different agencies and different nations often work in opposition to each other with self defeating results while the contributors differ on courses of action they offer fresh perspectives some examining significant case studies and laying the groundwork for future debate on these crucial issues

this volume reflects an evolving situation in the north of ireland where fiction has overtaken poetry and drama as the most significant and vital literary form through an analysis of representative texts kennedy andrews explores fiction from or about the north from the outbreak of the troubles in 1969 to the present day the bulk of the study covers recent fiction by new young writers born in the 1960s that grew up during the troubles to what extent can this new writing be seen to penetrate new literary terrain through versions of a pluralistic postmodern humanism to what extent does the new writing inaugurate new mappings of identity and culture beyond the simple binaries of protestant and catholic nationalist and unionist thereby suggesting new possibilities for the future to what extent does it cross other borders to present a transnational vision informed by the rest of ireland britain europe and america the study concludes by considering some of the questions raised by women s writing of the troubles the volume contains detailed assessments of such writers as tom clancy jack higgins gerald seymour terence de vere white eugene mccabe brian moore maurice
