through a masterful mix of poetry and prose the book of isaiah gives prophetic witness to the complex story of god s judgment against ancient israel and the enduring promise of divine redemption both unsettling and inspiring isaiah continues to enrich readers with its powerful condemnation of corruption and an uncompromising call for social justice part one of our study covers isaiah 1 39 including many of the prophet s most memorable passages commentary study and reflection questions prayers and access to online lectures are included 6 lessons the influence of isaiah on john s narrative and theology has long been recognized but it has yet to receive monograph length attention this study is a beginning attempt to fill that void through an examination of the use of isaiah in the crucial hinge of john s gospel john 12 1 43 beginning with a reading of isaiah 40 55 illustrating a way in which early christians may have read this important section of scripture the bulk of the study examines the pericopes in john 12 1 43 seeking to identify and interpret john s use of isaiah 52 53 it is concluded that a reading of this well known isaianic text rooted within its broader context in isaiah together with the mediating influence of other texts notably isa 6 9 10 and zech 9 9 10 has fueled much johannine theology christology and ecclesiology moreover mirroring the progression of isa 52 7 53 1 in john 12 is the author s way of underlining jesus identity as the servant of god and announcing that the second exodus prophesied by isaiah is secured by the rejection and death of jesus c 1 crouch and christopher b hays introduce the book of isaiah in its diverse historical contexts tracing its origins and development over several centuries beginning with the career of the prophet isaiah ben amoz in eighth century jerusalem continuing with a late seventh century edition and the further revisions made in the late sixth century and concluding with final shaping during the persian period at each stage crouch and havs pay close attention to the historical cultural and theological conversations that influenced the book s aims and interests crouch and hays discuss the theological and literary continuities among the book s contributors as well as where language and concerns differed from generation to generation they also consider the reception history of isaiah and what the text has meant to people through history with suggestions of further reading at the end of each chapter this guide will be an essential accompaniment to study of the book of isaiah following the oracles of destruction that dominate the earlier portion of the book of isaiah part two of our study covers isaiah 40 66 emphasizing the majesty of god and the divine plan for israel s restoration leslie hoppe s commentary continues to explore the history theology and poetry of this essential prophetic work making a case that isaiah is not so much about divine retribution as it is about liberation and a return to god s loving embrace commentary study and reflection questions prayers and access to online lectures are included 6 lessons this volume brings together a lively set of papers from the first session of the deuterocanonical and cognate literature program unit of the society of biblical literature annual meeting in 2016 together with a few later contributions these essays explore a number of thematic and textual issues as they trace the reception history of the book of isaiah in deuterocanonical and cognate literature for the early church fathers the prophecy of isaiah was not a compendium of jewish history or theology but an announcement of the coming messiah fulfilled in the life and ministry of jesus of nazareth in this accs bezüge widerstreiten the study deals with the theological message and composition of the book of isaiah and promotes a thesis that an early jewish reception history helps us to find perspectives to understand them this study treats the following themes among others 1 hezekiah as immanuel was an important theme in the reception as can be seen in chronicles and ben sira as well as in rabbinical writings the central event which makes hezekiah such an important figure was the annihilation of the assyrian army as recounted in isaiah 36 37 2 the book of isaiah was interpreted in apocalyptic milieu as the animal apocalypse and daniel show even though the qumran writings do not provide any coherent way to interpret isaianic passages its textual evidence shows how the community has found from the book of isaiah different concepts to characterize the division of the jewish community to the righteous and sinful ones cf isa 65 66 3 ezra and nehemiah received inspiration from the theological themes of isaianic texts of levitical singers which were later edited

in the book of isaiah by scribes the formation of the book of isaiah then went in its own way and its theology became different from that in the book of ezra nehemiah as interpreted by the ancient church fathers isaiah 40 66 leads readers to a deeper understanding of god s judgment and salvation the excerpts included in this accs volume offer us a rich array of differing styles principles and theological emphases from theodoret of cyr to eusebius and procopius to cyril of alexandria jerome and augustine in 1910 isaiah shembe was struggling he had left his family and quit his job as a sanitation worker to become a baptist evangelist but he ended his first mission without much to show little did he know that he would soon establish the nazaretha church as he began to attract attention from people left behind by industrial capitalism in south africa by his death in 1935 shembe was an internationally known prophet and healer described by his peers as better off than all the black people in a prophet of the people isaiah shembe and the making of a south african church historian lauren v jarvis provides a fascinating and intimate portrait of one of south africa s most famous religious figures and in turn the making of modern south africa following shembe from his birth in the 1860s across many environments and contexts jarvis illuminates the tight links between the spread of christianity strategies of evasion and the capacious forms of community that continue to shape south africa today value pluralism is the idea most prominently endorsed by isaiah berlin that fundamental human values are universal plural conflicting and incommensurable with one another incommensurability is the key component of pluralism undermining familiar monist philosophies such as utilitarianism but if values are incommensurable how do we decide between them when they conflict george crowder assesses a range of responses to this problem proposed by berlin and developed by his successors three broad approaches are especially important universalism contextualism and conceptualism crowder argues that the conceptual approach is the most fruitful yielding norms of value diversity personal autonomy and inclusive democracy historical context must also be taken into account together these approaches indicate a liberal politics of redistribution multiculturalism and constitutionalism and a public policy in which basic values are carefully balanced the problem of value pluralism isaiah berlin and beyond is a uniquely comprehensive survey of the political theory of value pluralism and also an original contribution by a leading voice in the pluralist literature scholars and researchers interested in the work of berlin liberalism value pluralism and related ideas will find this a stimulating and valuable source analysing policy documents from nine counterinsurgency wars elias asks why powerful militaries have difficulty managing local partners revealing a approach to the chapters is however open to considering third isaiah as a complex but coherent theological unity leaning on this approach abraham oh constructs a theology of isaiah 56 66 arguing that the theology of third isaiah has eschatology both prophetic and apocalyptic at its core he identifies four major themes and explores their significance through four key texts 56 1 8 59 15b 21 60 1 22 65 13 25 the covenant concept 56 1 8 forms a framework for the eschatology in these chapters people are invited to walk in the covenant which is worked out as eschatological salvation the coming of yhwh as the divine warrior initiates the eschatological era 59 15b 21 and bringing judgment restores the covenant as the temple city paradise 60 1 22 into which the nations flow the glorified zion is the eschatological fulfilment of the covenant zion and servant traditions the new heavens and earth 65 13 25 is a return to the primordial paradise where the natural world is restored as the problem of sin is resolved inspired by the author s preparation of two major commentaries on isaiah these essays range from comprehensive to specific and from popular to scholarly they first appeared in biblical dictionaries scholarly journals and popular periodicals gathered here together for the first time they display in various ways how the authors sees the various parts of isaiah functioning together to give a coherent message to the church the opening chapters lay out oswalt s understanding of the overall message of the book of isaiah subsequesnt chapters consider such themse as holiness the church are new scriptural interpretive methods that support theological claims rarely however has an exploration been undertaken to test the impact of this ecclesiological division on the reading spotlighting diamonds marijuana and extreme terror began in 1991 military leaders exploited the trio s transcendent power over their young fighters and captives once the war expired youth again turned to marley for inspiration and tupac for friendship thoroughly researched and accessibly written we the young fighters probes terror based warfare and how tupac rambo and especially bob marley wove their way into the fabric of alienation resistance and hope in sierra leone the tale of pop culture heroes radicalizing warfare and shaping peacetime underscores the need to engage with alienated youth and reform predatory governments the book ends with a framework for customizing the international response to these twin challenges vita mortuorum in memoria vivorum volume 5 of the beyond language series is dedicated to the memory of professor jacek fisiak one of the titans in english historical linguistics in poland and beyond for over 40 years he taught at adam mickiewicz university standard accounts of global twentieth century literary movements the eurocentric discourse of world literature focuses on transatlantic interactions largely omitting the international left and its asian members meanwhile postcolonial studies have overlooked the socialist aligned world in favor of the clash between western european imperialism and subaltern resistance clark provides the missing pieces illuminating a distinctive literature that sought to fuse european and vernacular asian traditions in the name of a post imperialist culture socialist literary internationalism was not without serious problems and at times it succumbed to an orientalist aesthetic that rivaled any coming from europe its history is marked by both promise and tragedy with clear eyed honesty clark traces the limits compromises and achievements of an ambitious cultural collaboration whose resonances in later movements can no longer be ignored a mural on a tin shack brings hope and happiness to a girl in socialist literary internationalism was not without serious problems and at times it succumbed to an orientalist aesthetic that rivaled any coming from europe its history is marked by both promise and tragedy with clear eyed honesty clark traces the limits compromises and achievements of an ambitious cultural collaboration whose resonances in later movements can no longer be ignored
