avant garde studies the relationship between the artist s work on childhood and his search for a transfigured concept of time this study also situates cornell and his art in the broader context of the transatlantic avant garde of the 1930s and 40s analisa leppanen guerra explores the children s stories that cornell perceived as fundamental in order to unpack the dense network of associations in his under studied multimedia works moving away from the usual focus on his box constructions the author directs her attention to cornell s film and theater scenarios explorations dossiers and book objects one highlight of this study is a work that may well be the first artist s book of its kind and has only been exhibited twice untitled journal d agriculture pratique presented as cornell s enigmatic tribute to lewis carroll s alice books
