influence occurs before a child reaches school age risk factors include parent intelligence and education family income family structure and size nutrition and specific parenting behaviors the fourth proposition flows from the second and third that the most promising avenues for maximizing intelligence come from a child s parents armor persuasively argues for a whole family approach whereby
