commonly faces in the american society my book goes into the odds i faced as a black man in that same society making the accomplishments i have this far in life but from a different more unique prospective my book is a tell all about my journey in life thus far and highlights the truth about the american society as it relates to every black person when gary mabbutt was 17 years old his life was shattered by the news that he was diabetic a professional footballer for third division bristol rovers and dreaming of representing his country nobody knew whether diabetes could be combined with professional football this book tells mabbutt s story which shows him exceeding all expectations and limitations taking him from bristol rovers to tottenham hotspur and to representing england at senior level including the inevitable setbacks his relationship with top players and management as well as the media a chapter on the hillsborough disaster and his hopes for the future against all odds gives an inside look at first division football the odds are i was born in post world war ii belgium my parents lost most of their extended family to the holocaust and their marriage is on the rocks by age five my father left my mother thrusting the family into destitution at that time it seemed that humanity was coming back to be a just society aux contraire mon frere just because the war over being jewish in europe did not equate to an easy life i had questions about god faith and prayers to which none were ever answered i watched my sister recover from a tragic fire that left her disfigured is this the true test of faith didn t we already have enough on our plate then i started asking real questions why would god let you win millions in the lottery yet let millions go hungry this memoir spans six decades of everything imaginable love tragedy misery family good times and bad times after reading my book you will realize that anything we do in life will be equated to the odds of success or failure and not necessarily fate faith or prayers a powerful and moving story of a man s struggle against fate and his ultimate triumph over it on 18 june 1994 kishore shantabai kale passed his mbbs his dream of becoming a doctor had been attained after long years of struggle the illegitimate son of shantabai a tamasha dancer from kolhati community and a local politician
