2010-08 the essential guide by one of america s leading doctors to how digital technology enables all of us to take charge of our health a trip to the doctor is almost a guarantee of misery you ll make an appointment months in advance you ll probably wait for several hours until you hear the doctor will see you now but only for fifteen minutes then you ll wait even longer for lab tests the results of which you ll likely never see unless they indicate further and more invasive tests most of which will probably prove unnecessary much like physicals themselves and your bill will be astronomical in the patient will see you now eric topol one of the nation s top physicians shows why medicine does not have to be that way instead you could use your smartphone to get rapid test results from one drop of blood monitor your vital signs both day and night and use an artificially intelligent algorithm to receive a diagnosis without having to see a doctor all at a small fraction of the cost imposed by our modern healthcare system the change is powered by what topol calls medicine s gutenber moment much as the printing press took learning out of the hands of a priestly class the mobile internet is doing the same for medicine giving us unprecedented control over our healthcare with smartphones in hand we are no longer beholden to an impersonal and paternalistic system in which doctor knows best medicine has been digitized topol argues now it will be democratized computers will replace physicians for many diagnostic tasks citizen science will give rise to citizen medicine and enormous data sets will give us new means to attack conditions that have long been incurable massive open online medicine where diagnostics are done by facebook like comparisons of medical profiles will enable real time real world research on massive populations there s no doubt the path forward will be complicated the medical establishment will resist these changes and digitized medicine inevitably raises serious issues surrounding privacy nevertheless the result better cheaper and more human health care will be worth it provocative and engrossing the patient will see you now is essential reading for anyone who thinks they deserve better health care that is for all of us

what a society chooses to feed its children reveals much about its tastes and ideas regarding health in this groundbreaking historical work amy bentley explores how the invention of commercial baby food shaped american notions of infancy and influenced the evolution of parental and pediatric care until the late nineteenth century infants were almost exclusively fed breast milk but over the course of a few short decades americans began feeding their babies formula and solid foods frequently as early as a few weeks after birth by the 1950s commercial baby food had become emblematic of all things modern in postwar america little jars of baby food were thought to resolve a multitude of problems in the domestic sphere they reduced parental anxieties about nutrition and health they made caretakers feel empowered and they offered women entering the workforce an irresistible convenience but these baby food products laden with sugar salt and starch also became a gateway to the industrialized diet that blossomed during this period today baby food continues to be shaped by medical commercial and parenting trends baby food producers now contend with health and nutrition problems as well as the rise of alternative food movements all of this matters because as the author suggests it is during infancy that american palates become acclimated to tastes and textures including those of highly processed minimally nutritious and calorie dense industrial food products
